B.11 Best UN MDG Award

I – Background:

In September 2000, at the UN Millennium Summit, world leaders agreed to a set of time bound and measurable goals and targets for combating poverty, hunger, disease, illiteracy, environmental degradation and discrimination against women.

Placed at the heart of the global agenda, they are now called the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and are consisted of eight topics:

1. Eradicate extreme poverty and hunger
2. Achieve universal primary education
3. Promote gender equality and empower women
4. Reduce child mortality
5. Improve maternal health
6. Combat HIV/AIDS, malaria and other diseases
7. Ensure environmental sustainability
8. Develop a global partnership for development

The MDGs provide a framework for the entire UN system to work coherently together towards a common end. In this context, the world is making progress toward the MDGs, but it is uneven and too slow. A large majority of nations will reach the MDGs only if they get substantial support – advocacy, expertise and resources – from outside such as Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) like JCI.



Thus, as the result of the 2003 JCI-UN Leadership Summit held at UN Headquarters itself in New York, JCI took over the responsibility to also contribute to the efforts of UN and presented a resolution supporting the UN MDGs, which is the main program put into practice by the Office of UN Secretary General Kofi Annan.

<p>Eradicate extreme poverty and hunger</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Reduce by half the proportion of people living on less than a dollar a day; ● Reduce by half the proportion of people who suffer from hunger
<p>Achieve universal primary education</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Ensure that all boys and girls complete a full course of primary schooling
<p>Promote gender equality and empower women</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Eliminate gender disparity in primary and secondary education preferably by 2005, and at all levels by 2015
<p>Reduce child mortality</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Reduce by two thirds the mortality rate among children under five
<p>Improve maternal health</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Reduce by three quarters the maternal mortality ratio
<p>Combat HIV/AIDS, malaria and other disease</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Halt and begin to reverse the spread of HIV/AIDs; ● Halt and begin to reverse the incidence of malaria and other major diseases
<p>Ensure environmental sustainability</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Integrate the principles of sustainable development into country policies and programmes; reverse loss of environmental resources; ● Reduce by half the proportion of people without sustainable access to safe drinking water; ● Achieve significant improvement in lives of at least 100 million slum dwellers, by 2020

<p>Develop a global partnership for development</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Develop further an open trading and financial system that is rule-based, predictable and non-discriminatory. Includes a commitment to good governance, development and poverty reduction-nationally and internationally. ● Address the least developed countries' special needs. This includes tariff-and quota-free access for their exports; enhanced debt relief for heavily indebted poor countries; cancellation of official bilateral debt; and more generous official development assistance for countries committed to poverty reduction; ● Address the special needs of landlocked and small island developing States; ● Deal comprehensively with developing countries' debt problems through national and international measures to make debt sustainable in the long term; ● In cooperation with the developing countries, develop decent and productive work for youth; ● In cooperation with pharmaceutical companies, provide access to affordable essential drugs in developing countries; ● In cooperation with the private sector, make available the benefits of new technologies – especially information and communications technologies.

3. Members must have been in his/her chapters since the inauguration of the year.
4. Members must have participated in at least 1 NOM projects and 3 LOM projects at the time of awards judging.
5. Members must have completed most of the items of jobs that have been assigned to him/her at the time of awards judging.

Upon completion of judging of all awards under JCI Macao, a committee comprised of at least one judge from each subcommittee, shall review the award winning entries to select the “Best Local Project of the Year.” The winner of all awards listed will automatically become the entries for this award.
