What is Training 101

On the 17th May 2022, 18 of bright and energetic potential trainers gathered at the JCI Macao Office to attend the "Training 101 Elementary Training Knowledge and Skills", by Head Trainer - JCI Senator Jethro Pun and Assistant Trainer Meng Fai Leong. The course, Training 101, is a 3-hour course coached by experienced trainers, targeted to effectively teach members the foundation knowledge on philosophy of adult learning, how to create a short training course, and basic presentation skills for becoming a successful trainer. This course is for all members who would like to gain an understanding of the opportunities that can be gained from being a trainer.

What is training?

Training is a platform for providing its participants with knowledge or skills to increase their efficiency and/or effectiveness in carrying out a specific task. Training is a platform for positive change.

Training is to help participants to change to be better. The goal of training is to learn. Trainers are NOT entertainers, having fun can be a by-product of training, but it must NOT be the goal of training.

Who can be a trainer?

Being a trainer gives us the opportunity to stand on stage and connect with participants, as well as to demonstrate your skills and knowledge. The way to connect with your participants is however an individual training style, but is generally made through our words and body:

- 1. Eye contact
- 2. Friendly facial expressions
- 3. Proper use of voice and manner of speaking
 - 4. Proper use of gestures
 - 5. Proper postures
 - 6. Proper positioning on stage

The goal of trainer is to deliver your training content to participants and the way to deliver the content helps participants to receive and understand the designed content.










Date with Senator 黃昇雄青商參議員 JCI Senator Kent Wong

INTERVIEW

Billy Kuok



- 1. What are some experiences you can share when your business is fighting against the depressing economy during the pandemic? Any changes under this New Normal?
 - To counter the current economy, we have considered joining online delivery platforms, but we have considered the factor of food quality as it may get affected, we finally decided to keep it at our own pace and didn't join. Actually, we have built some customer base from the social circles of our shareholders and with the connections of local organisations like JCI (should I mention others). To be honest, it is hard to attract or call for tourists to come at the moment, so we do have some sort of promotions but what really helped is banquets held by local organisations and words of mouth by friends who actually came to the restaurant and tried and liked our food. Of course, we have outstanding quality control of our food so people would willingly recommend it to others. And then we have our services. Our team are all very experienced and we have regular internal training to make sure we can improve our services to make our customers feel welcome and comfortable.

NP: Billy, have you noticed or seen that some industries did not worsen, and in contrast, they rose during the pandemic in recent years?

• It is a medical technical system company that we

have been building up. Since this is an IT business it won't be affected by the rental cost of a street shop. It hasn't been launched but it will be around April to May 2022. I'm partnered with one of the JCI members, Davii. He is also my partner and the main developer and operator of the business. As it is a technical software system, it wouldn't be affected by rent and tourist rates.

(So in other words, this pandemic has driven the development of the medical and tech field?)

Yes, and it is more like, the circumstances have pushed everyone to walk out of their comfort zone. And it pushes us to be more innovative in order to survive. Macau has been in its comfort zone for too long with tourism and the blossoming of the gambling industry, hostel industry along with food and beverages industry. But when tourism has been devastated as tourists cannot come to Macau, it dragged all the industries with it.

(And this pandemic pushes us to have more variety of business fields?)

Yes, and if we focus on the negative, the whole ecosystem of business and the economy of Macau will fall into a negative cycle. So we should stay positive, the pandemic pushes the people of Macau to think more and be innovative about how to survive and thrive in new areas in this new normal.

NP: What do you think for the direction of Moderate Economic Diversification in Macau?

• It might be hard to listen but we should take conservative out. When the more mature entrepreneurs like us, we have survived and endured in this world for so long. Our minds have been trapped and framed by our government and many rules of this society. We are too exhausted to ask our government for any innovations or new creations. They might want to but they simply do not have the energy to fight for it anymore. No offence, they might be a little disappointed even with the system. With the fresh and new younger generations, maybe they can find new ways to combine different businesses and industries together and be able to stir the pot of this government a bit and create some new policies. Not with the good



old loans and funds for tech and data and F&B or whatever industry. We don't need the money, we need their support for our future development. We want actual directions and support from them. Like medicine and tech, we have visited the Economic Bureau. And they have a good policy in which they match up to our different projects with different faculties of different universities. The talents that are studying and familiar with certain areas are able to help. They can secure a job and we don't have to waste our time headhunting. It created the winwin situation I talked about. We can strengthen and promote this kind of policy that already exists and actually helps. We can let people outside Macau know that we do not just have gambling industry related business. The gambling industry has been in its extremely comfortable zone for a long time. And so are the businesses related to them like food and beverages, retail, clothing manufacturers, everything. The gambling-related businesses are so enormous that everyone was enjoying it way too much and it's a comfort zone. We gotta change. The older generations are scared. And we made the younger ones scared as well. They discouraged their kids not to taking risks and not taking the leap of faith. When this has become a habit, Macau cannot and won't change for the better. The fear comes from this pandemic and the fact that they do not have a safety net. So our government should think of some policies that can provide them with some security. I really hope young entrepreneurs can rise and create a better economic ecosystem for Macau. The whole world has been beaten down by this pandemic. But we gotta survive and live our lives. Hope that the government can also provide us with some helpful and practical policies and show new hope for the youngsters.





2. What visions or expectations do you have for 2022 and 2023?

• Do not die and survive hopefully, hahaha, just joking. Well.. visions and expectations for 2022 and 2023. Well, I'm fortunate that I'm not just depending on the food and beverages business for a living. Well, in the big picture, for me, I really hope everyone can work together. And I understand that everyone has to put themselves first and it is hard to think about mutual development and things like that when you're under such pressure. But we really have to think about it, when at this time period where we are isolated, how do we coexist here in this small city called Macau. How do we maintain our reputation? Moderate Economic Diversification has been just talking for over 3 years now. How do we show the world, that Macau CAN survive without the gambling industry? How do we get resources? Well, for food and beverages, we can join communities and organisations. When we can guarantee the quality of our food, we can honestly refer to our name, Lao Shanghai, to you and our friends in JCI. When we can guarantee our quality we can go out and see how we can rise with our allies just the hostel industry and survive together and create a breakthrough together. The very first thing we have to keep in mind is that we are here and we are here to survive, now to compete and win against the rest of the world. Furthermore, as I mentioned before, we should provide opportunities like internships to students. They can obtain experience and we can earn some reputations and references. It creates a win-win situation where everyone can benefit.

INTERVIEW 酌月訪談 with Luna





Why did you choose to open a new restaurant, Luna, in the midst of the pandemic?



Teddy (the person in charge of Luna) opened a new restaurant with 4 aspects - the business district, interior design, cuisine, and service. The business district was looking for new firms at that time. We considered that the environment was appropriate and that the conditions were favourable for entering the market. Moreover, my business partners have a variety of backgrounds, including those in the restaurant and bar industries. As a designer, one of my partners was able to incorporate fresh and creative concepts into the restaurant's design, giving customers a unique dining experience. Besides, Szechuan cuisine was picked because it is one of the top 10 dishes in China and the increasing popularity in Chinese style. As a result, we asked a well-known Michelin twostar restaurant's chef to serve as our head chef. With regard to client service, we regularly train our staff to learn about our customers' tastes, particularly their preferences for sourness and spice. The chefs will make every effort to improve the service by understanding the preferences of our customers. Additionally, we have presented the most recent method of mixing alcohol and tea to create unique cocktails. We also put a lot of effort into the selection of tableware to bring our customers the greatest environment, cuisine, and service.

In this way, Luna was opened boldly during the pandemic. The restaurant has been operated for a year, and although the profits have not been as expected, its reputation has remained positive.



Should SMEs diversify and how should they do so?



Teddy agrees with the necessity for development and backs the government's philosophy and notion of SME diversification. Small businesses, however, are constrained by their resources, expertise, and experience. Can they thus cope with diversification? How can small enterprises obtain resources they need to grow into medium-sized companies? Perhaps it is easier for medium-sized enterprises to transform and diversify since they have more resources. Using himself as an example, he managed a bar, and if he plans to transform it into a Hong Kong-style cafe, which emphasizes efficiency, can he find experienced and efficient staff? Is the transformation financially feasible given that there is no prior expertise in cafes and a rapid start from scratch? Every hurdle is a difficult one. Horizontal development across many industry sectors and areas is more difficult than vertical development. Large businesses find it simpler to expand across industries because they have the necessary capital and resources, but SMEs find it more challenging and the government may not be offering enough support.

What government policies can help SMEs?

Teddy believes that the most considerable support from the government is funding, which is absolutely helpful. Applications for grants to fight the pandemic and launch new businesses have become much more lenient in recent years. While basic concerns including a shortage of experts, outdated technology, and imported labor have not been much helped, this may merely fix the visible issues. Once, a young friend requested funding from the government to launch a business. He opened and renovated a new store, but he quickly had to shut it down because he didn't know how to run it while rent and staffing issues came along. The young friend will regrettably have to shoulder the burden of hundreds of thousands of dollars. It is simple to borrow money but challenging to run a business for young people who have never done it. It implies that this is not precisely a positive sign. Returning to the question, although the government's intentions were good, the essential assistance was not adequately provided. Indeed, business owners have a greater responsibility to bear and cannot always rely entirely on government assistance. Therefore, if the government wishes to help SMEs effectively, it should concentrate on the fundamental problems.



Outlook for 2022, 2023



We hope to develop it to be a externally recognized brand for Macau so that domestic and foreign visitors will come to Luna for the sake of Szechuan cuisine with Macau's local flavour. The goal is to establish Szechuan food as a Macau specialty, promote Chinese cuisine overseas, increase the impact of international exposure for Chinese cuisine, and rise awareness that Macau has a national cuisine as well. On the other hand, my employees are responsible for more than 20 families and I do not want to ruin their families due to the failure of my company. In the long run, we hope to make Luna an iconic brand in Macau and create a positive impact on other industries besides catering. We also wish to develop Luna into a group brand so that we can fully diversify our growth. We will create our own resources and a platform to look for more resources, despite the fact that the available resources are restricted because we cannot completely rely on outside help.

The Delivery of Aspirations and Spirits of the "Two Sessions" (兩會精神傳達)

The "Two Sessions", the annual general assembly of China's top legislature and political consultative body, are where China's major policies and measures are discussed and formed, and also serve as great opportunities for politicians and citizens to observe how China's top state leaders relate to the legislators and advisors, and demonstrate their political values.

On the 31st March 2022, a very inspiring and informative sharing session was held at the Headquarters of Education and Youth Development Bureau. The two shared opinions and views on promoting the construction of Hengqin Guangdong Macao Deep Cooperation Zone, as well as "Patriots Governing Macao", National Identity, National Security and other related topics. "One Country, Two Systems" has been successfully implemented ever since the return of Macao to the country, and emphasised that the Central
